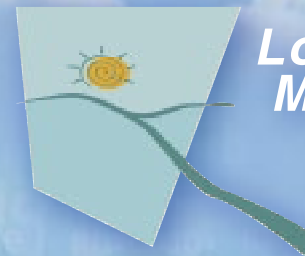

History

Since its inception in 1998, the Loddon Murray Community Leadership Program (LMCLP) has helped to build leadership skills, explore the major issues facing the North Central region, and facilitated positive change in the community.

Program Objectives

- Develop creative, courageous, confident community leaders.
- Build on existing personal and community leadership skills.
- Raise awareness and understanding of regional issues, resources and networks.
- Foster a regional leadership network.

How this is achieved

When

Each program runs for nine months between February and October.

Where

Program days are held across the North Central region of Victoria in a variety of towns and cities.

The group also travels to Canberra and Melbourne.

How

Participants are required to attend four weekend retreats and two program days per month (Monday/Friday). During these program days they will be engaged in workshops to improve leadership skills, hear from inspirational speakers, and explore issues relevant to the region.



Who can apply?

Applications are encouraged from women and men over the age of 18, who have a broad range of backgrounds and life experiences.

The program strives for diversity through representation from the agriculture, business, government and community sectors.

The program covers the City of Greater Bendigo, Rural City of Swan Hill and shires of Gannawarra, Loddon, Campaspe, Buloke, Northern Grampians, Central Goldfields, Mount Alexander, Hepburn and Macedon Ranges.

Investing in rural communities:

Graduates of the program are expected to undertake a specific community project and use their increased skills, knowledge and confidence to actively support their community and the wider region.
